#### POVERTY ERADICATION

Helping girls from financially backward circumstances at the ATMA Gurukulam Children's Home to come out of the poverty cycle by giving them access to quality education, opportunities for sustenance, and individual mentoring support.

This year, 2 more girls at ATMA Gurukulam have secured admission for Undergraduate Courses. enabling them to look forward to gainful employment in the near future. So far, we have enabled and supported 5 girls to pursue higher education.






