ATMA RAILWAY CHILD HELP DESK





17 children were rescued in December at the Thrissur Railway station premises. Through the outreach programme, awareness about Childline was given to 114 children and 352 adults. On 10th December, the RCHD team, along with the Collab team, conducted an awareness session on Childline.



The Puppet Show method was used for awareness, which was attended by 50 children and 12 children at the Geetha Ravi Public School, Valappad.

The team also participated in a capacity building programme conducted by the Childline Nodal Agency on 29th December.
